

PHOENIX RISING - SHELTER UPDATE

It is our intention to make the new Humane Society of Durham Region a universal project. We want everyone to be apart of the new shelter. If you buy a brick, a park bench or plant a tree, we will need your help. And when you come to visit you can feel proud that you helped to make it happen. The animals that you save don't care if you live in Whitby, Toronto or anywhere in Ontario or around the world, they only ask for food, shelter and love. We will regularly update the web site page to keep everyone informed as to our progress and costs involved.

So far have put an offer of \$420,000.00 on a 2.15 acre parcel of land, southeast corner of Wentworth St.E / William Smith Dr. in Whitby. The offer has been accepted conditional on rezoning and environmental study. We have hired The Firm Independent Project Manager and the process has been started! An architectural drawing has been submitted, as you can see on the next page. An offer to purchase application is going forward!

We are moving forward to obtain site approval. This process includes architectural preliminary design drawings for the building in co ordination with engineering that will include servicing and grading, erosion and sediment control, storm water management and landscape design. The consultant fees for the above site plan approval services is \$14080.00 plus GST.

Site plan approval is all still in the preliminary stages, along with the rezoning, before we can move ahead to a building permit. It's all baby steps one at a time. I am hopeful all of these preliminary processes can be completed by the end of June.

Two architectural firms are submitting drawings and proposals for us to consider for the new building. It will be based on 6000 square feet of space, 14-15 dog apartments with outdoor runs as well, compared to six indoor kennels in our previous shelter. Cat and kitten condos with an enclosed indoor/outdoor play area, a separate little animal room, staff and volunteer lunchroom, which they never had, appropriate ventilation and airflow which is so necessary to keep illness minimal, a small fenced area where our dogs can play together and beautifully landscaped grounds with trees, bushes and a walking path with benches where prospective new parents can take our dogs for a stroll and socialize with them.

It is our dream to make this shelter as environmentally friendly as possible. If anyone has any ideas or can help us in this regard with solar windows, toilets, water accumulation, geothermal etc, we need you. We need all supplies to make this shelter happen. Many businesses and individuals have come forward right after the fire. We hope you are all still willing with your offers.

SHELTER FUNDRAISING

To pay for the purchase of the land, \$420 000, we will be using the money that everyone so kindly donated after the fire and the remainder will be money from our investments. **WE ARE STARTING A FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN TO RAISE \$1.5 MILLION DOLLARS FOR THE ACTUAL BUILDING.** Many of you will gasp at that amount. We can do it! Corporate sponsorship, individuals, service clubs, schools, grants, maybe even the government. Ottawa Humane Society just received 1.8 million dollars from the federal government for their rebuild project. Phoenix Rising will happen one brick at a time. We will be forming a volunteer committee who will have time, commitment and knowledge to take on this task. Further information will be upcoming.

WHY SPAY AND NEUTER?

Remember, one female dog and her offspring can produce 67 000 dogs in six years. One female cat and her offspring can produce 420 000 cats in seven years. Every year in Ontario, tens of thousands of dogs and cats are destroyed or discarded. We do not euthanize our animals for length of stay, but we are overwhelmed in our tiny temporary shelter with ever increasing numbers.

Our current numbers in our various shelters include 5 dogs, 42 adult cats in the shelter, 10 adult cats in foster, 10 kittens in the shelter and 25 kittens in foster, 10 birds (cockatiels), 8 guinea pigs, 7 rabbits, 17 rats (approx 2 months old). Why spay or Neuter? Why indeed!

FOSTER HOMES NEEDED

We need foster parents now more than ever because of our lack of space to house animals. Cats, cats with kittens, occasional dogs...our space is limited, so please if you can for any length of time, we need you.

Special Needs Adopted

We've added a new segment about some of our long term or special needs animals that have been recently adopted into loving new homes. Kay has written a little blurb about some of the animals that often got passed over because of age, looks or disposition. Now they are happy endings. As you read these wonderful stories, remember this is all possible because of your support and belief in us.

Adoptions have been going great at our temporary shelter: most cats are being adopted out within 3 months of their arrival!

Bonded pair adoptions have been phenomonal too: Bosen and Ensign, Napoleon and Bonaparte, Cuddles and Jaguar, Lucky and Tom, Pantera and Eeyore and Ryan and Reynold were all able to remain together instead of being adopted separately.

Senior cats like Smokey, Pepsi, Boots, Vinnie and Panther have also been placed quickly as well. Both Vinnie and Panther are special needs cats who had serious medical conditions that required extensive surgery. We have received updates on all of our seniors and I am happy to report that all of them are doing well and are greatly loved and spoiled in their new homes!

After working out of Animal Services after the fire, certain staff members fell in love with their cats and they kindly allowed us to take them to our temporary shelter. Penelope was deathly ill with the kitty cold and is completely deaf as well. She ended up being one of our very first adoptions here at the shelter! Arnold and Billy were staff favorites as well and both were adopted in less than four days of their arrival as they are such amazing boys. We have received wonderful updates from both of their adoptive parents informing us that these cats have been perfect additions to their households.

Panda Bear arrived at Animal Services on the day of the fire and was stricken with the often deadly calici virus. I fell in love with this exceptional cat and for six weeks he valiantly fought the virus with the assistance of the staff at Animal Services (they bought him a vaporizer, provided medications and special food) and lots of cuddles at least twice a day from me and other Humane Society staff. He is now in a loving and wonderful foster home where he is thriving, active and mischievious beyond belief! He is virus-free but still needs a bit of assistance in remembering how to eat on his own.

Currently we have a few special needs cats like Jenny who need experienced owners with lots of love and patience and a quiet home so she can build her trust and confidence in people again. Shinobi has had a history of urinary tract problems and may require prescription food the rest of his life. And Ruby and Sebastian are a brother and sister pair who cannot be separated as Sebastian will sink into a depression and stop eating. They are a wonderful pair who may also need a calorie-controlled diet and designated playtime due to their size! Adopting a special needs cat or pair is not for every household but for those that can provide the environment that these cats need, the reward of seeing their progress over time is both heartwarming and immeasurable!

On Saturday February 21, we held our annual Swing Shift Big Band Dance at the Legion Hall on Simcoe St S in Oshawa. Again, it snowed.



Edelweiss Flowers and Gifts



Gift of Life *

So many in need. We have spent thousands of dollars caring for these poor little ones, suffering and in pain. We will mention but a few.

Candy - A poor little lab pup, less than 8 weeks old, adopted and flown up from South America. Imagine taken too young from her mom put on a long flight in the cargo area, only to come here and not be properly cared for. We took her immediately to the veterinarian. She had parvo. For four days they tried to save this little one, but unfortunately she wasn't able to fight any longer. They called from the emergency vet clinic in the middle of the night and we had her gently put to sleep.

Tabitha – a weak little kitten had to have her eye removed. **Hope** – another tabby kitten had a badly broken leg which required veterinary care.

BABY BERNARD


